



# How Do We Know If A County Is Positioned To Reduce Number Of People With Mental Illness In Jail?

- 1. Is your leadership committed?
- 2. Do you have timely screening and assessment?
- 3. Do you have baseline data?
- 4. Have you conducted a comprehensive process analysis and service inventory?
- 5. Have you prioritized policy, practice, and funding?
- 6. Do you track progress?



### FOUR KEY MEASURES




1. Reduce the number of people with mental illnesses booked into jails



2. Shorten the length of stay in jails for people with mental illnesses



3. Increase the number of people with mental illnesses connected to treatment



4. Reduce rates of recidivism

# ATHENS-CLARKE COUNTY, GA

	706 Advantage Clients*	1,135 Not Advantage Clients
History of multiple arrests	91%	68%
Average # of lifetime arrests	12.7	5.4
Total lifetime arrests	8,986	6,095
Average length of stay in jail	22.7 days	8.1 days
Return to jail in 2016	53%	36%



<sup>\*65%</sup> of clients had a MH diagnosis, 35% had a SU diagnosis, 47% had a co-occurring diagnosis

# **Aligned Strategies with Four Key Measures:**

- Implement co-responder program & expand number of CIT officers
- 2. Coordination with local judicial system; expanded treatment court opportunities
- 3. Implementing screening & assessment; expanded pre- & post-release planning efforts
- 4. Partnerships with probation & community supervision



# Assist-Identify-Divert (AID) Program

- Started in March 2016
- 224 eligible
- 137 participants
- 80% (112) successfully completed

# **Post-Incarceration Case Management Results**


- Of first 40 clients, only two rearrested, one re-incarcerated
- Recidivism rate dropped from 56% to 2.5% for this pop.
- Estimated savings of \$2,600/day and \$957K/year for the one case manager



### NORTHERN OREGON

- BJMHS Implementation
- Increased Treatment and Case Management Capacity
- Sub-Acute Mental Health Treatment Unit
- JMHCP Grant 30-Day Treatment and Reentry Program






#### **Treatment and Reentry Program**

- 196 people eligible
- 87 people completed treatment
- 47% recidivism v. 61% for control
- 58% Reduction in Jail Population with MH Diagnosis in Year 1
